School Trip Helpful Hints Guide

- Download a copy of the park map and post it in your class room. Use it to indicate the location the FIRST AID STATION and CLASS CHECK IN LOCATION. It might also help to mark the various locations the students are scheduled to visit and examine.
- Be sure permission slips indicate any special medical needs or allergies such as bee stings. Bring copies of permission slips and parent contact information with you on your trip. You can hold onto them or leave them at the First Aid Station along with your contact information should a student come to First Aid.
- Instruct students to carry as little as possible to help minimize time at security and the chance to lose expensive electronics.
- Advise students that studded belts and other metal objects will need to be removed and all bags will need to be checked at security. Inappropriate items will need to be brought to a locker, brought back to the bus, vehicle or disposed of.
- No food or drink is permitted in the park. They must be left in the vehicle, in a locker or disposed of.
- Assign students to lab groups of 5. In larger groups, no one will feel pressured to ride. Anyone wanting to ride will probably have a partner and non-riders will have people to ask about sensations. Less equipment will be needed with larger groups.
- Distribute tickets to your students as they get off the bus. If you have purchased a meal of any kind, let your students know that all tickets and meal vouchers are like cash and cannot be replaced.
- Park Policies can be found in the map & guide. The park may eject any person without refund for not adhering to these policies.
- Complimentary admission is available to the bus drivers. The Security Guard posted at the bus parking lot will give your bus driver a card to hand in with their CDL at Guest Relations for complimentary admission valid for that day only.
- Guests wishing to leave & re-enter the same day must have their hand stamped and retain their ticket stub. Any changes to the re-entry policy will be posted.
- Make sure students know exactly when and where to meet the bus and arrange times and places where chaperones can be found throughout the day. Let your students know that messages can be left at Guest Relations.
