



Six Flags Great America Bus & Group Procedures



ATTENTION GROUP LEADERS: The following is standard procedure for Bus Group Admission to Six Flags Great America & Six Flags Hurricane Harbor. To expedite the process, we ask for you to please familiarize yourself with these procedures.

BUS GROUP ADMISSION PROCEDURES

A Six Flags representative will greet your bus upon arrival, collect the \$10 bus parking fee, instruct the driver on where to park and then issue a voucher for a single one-day complimentary admission ticket to the bus driver only if they want to go into the Park for the day. The voucher can be redeemed at the Guest Services Office in the Park Entrance Plaza. Buses, dropping off their passengers, will be charged a \$10 drop off fee. If you previously indicated that you will be dropping off passengers versus parking, one drop off voucher is included with this packet for every 50 tickets ordered. The vouchers are valid for the 2011 season only. If the voucher is not given to the parking attendant, the bus will be charged \$10.

Six Flags requires all groups to have an adult chaperone or group leader for each bus (minimum 21 years of age with a valid ID verifying age).

To ensure your group's safety, an adult chaperone will be required to stay in the Park and may be contacted if problems occur with group members.

Buses arriving with unruly guests will be **refused admission and escorted from Six Flags property immediately**. Specifically, the following conditions can/will lead to a bus group being **denied** admission:

- **The lack of an adult chaperone or group leader for each bus** (min **21 years of age** with valid ID)
- Disorderly behavior, profanity or threats.
- The presence of alcohol, illegal drugs or any type of weapon.

Organizations and group leaders who bring unruly guests to Six Flags will risk being refused admission to the park and will immediately be escorted from Six Flags property. In addition, any future business relationship with Six Flags may be impaired.

PLEASE read this information to your group BEFORE coming to SIX FLAGS!

The following items **CANNOT** be brought into Six Flags:

- ⊗ Food or beverage (with the exception of baby food and special dietary needs)
- ⊗ Coolers, water jugs, radios or CD players
- ⊗ Alcohol, illegal drugs or any type of weapon

REMEMBER...

- ✓ Six Flags uses an Electronic Metal Detection System at the front entry gates. Purses, knapsacks, bags, etc. are subject to search. Refusal to submit to a search will result in no admission to the park or ejection from Six Flags property.
- ✓ Consumption of alcohol in the parking lot is strictly prohibited under Village of Gurnee local ordinance.
- ✓ Shoplifting is against the law and all offenders will be prosecuted.
- ✓ Line jumping, profanity or other disorderly behavior will not be tolerated. **Violators will be ejected from the Park and/or Six Flags property without a refund.**
- ✓ **Smoking is prohibited, unless in a designated area.** Please see Park map for locations.

Six Flags has a Dress Code.

Great America:

- 1) Shirts (no bikini tops allowed) and shoes must be worn at all times.
- 2) Clothing with obscene or offensive words, sayings or depictions are strictly prohibited and Six Flags management reserves the right to deem such clothing inappropriate.

Hurricane Harbor:

- 1) In order to participate in any waterpark activities, guests must wear a lined swimsuit. Street clothes, cut-off shorts, denim shorts or athletic clothing is not allowed in any water area. In addition, swimwear with buttons, snaps, rivets or zippers are not allowed.
- 2) Swimsuits are allowed in the Hurricane Harbor waterpark only and must be appropriate for our family environment. No revealing or thong swimsuits are allowed.
- 3) Guest shoes are not allowed in any attraction. Aqua socks are not allowed on slides.
- 4) Park Management may judge revealing clothing inappropriate.
