

**SIX FLAGS CALIFORNIA  
MAGIC MOUNTAIN & HURRICANE HARBOR  
PARK POLICIES**

Six Flags is proud to be the premier destination for group visits. Our number one priority is to provide you with a safe and wholesome environment during your visit. To assure this, we ask all Guests, including groups, to respect all park policies. Some important policies are:

- ◆ All groups must be accompanied by at least one responsible adult chaperone (i.e. faculty, youth leader, or parent). For larger groups, a minimum of one group leader for every 40 guests is required.
  
- ◆ Cannot be brought on Park property:
  - Alcohol
  - Illegal drugs or controlled substances
  - Any type of weapon
  
- ◆ Cannot be brought inside the Park:
  - Coolers
  - Water jugs
  - Radios, tape players (except compact versions with personal headphones)
  - Food or beverage (except baby food and special dietary food)
  
- ◆ Disorderly behavior, line cutting, and profanity are not tolerated and could result in removal from the Park.
  
- ◆ All bags, knapsacks, packages, and purses are subject to inspection.
  
- ◆ “Six Flags is a smoke-free environment. In consideration of other Guests, please utilize the designated smoking areas while inside the Park. Smoking is prohibited on all rides, queue lines, attractions, theatres, shops, midways and restaurants.”
  
- ◆ Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times (Six Flags Magic Mountain) – revealing clothing is not allowed.
  
- ◆ Clothing with obscene or offensive depictions or words is not allowed.

## **HURRICANE HARBOR ADDITIONAL PARK POLICIES**

- ◆ Traditional swimwear is required. Swimsuits must be appropriate for a family environment. No provocative/thong swimsuits. Swimsuits with rivets, metal buckles, or metal ornaments are not allowed on the waterslides. No long pants or cut-off shorts allowed.
- ◆ Footwear is recommended (aqua shoes or aqua sport sandals) but must be taken off to ride several of the slides.
- ◆ We recommend all small children and inexperienced swimmers wear life jackets available free-of-charge at Captain Buoy's Raft Rentals.
- ◆ Safety is everyone's responsibility. Our Lifeguards are highly trained and qualified: please adhere to their instructions.

All bus groups should enter the Park using the far-left toll plaza lane. Bus drivers (full size bus of 20 passengers or more) will receive a complimentary "Bus Driver's Pass" upon entering the parking lot. Please have your driver present his/her Class 2 (or equivalent) driver's license to the Host or Hostess.

To ensure that you and your group have a safe and memorable day, please familiarize your group with Six Flags Park Policies. Please note that your group leader must:

- ◆ Be a mature individual (i.e. faculty, youth leader, parent)
- ◆ Possess valid identification
- ◆ Remain in the Park and respond to a page if necessary

If at any time you need assistance during your visit, please contact any member of our Host and Hostess team in Guest Relations located at the front gate. We will help you in any way possible.

One other suggestion...it's always a good idea to select a meeting site before you enter the Park, so that everyone in your group can get back together at the end of the day. **We are not able to page for separated groups!**
