- Cirkus Berzerkus: Rated the best 3D haunted attraction in the Southwest, by Hauntworld.com, you'll dread to join in this circus because you might end up dead. Additional fee required.
- Cadaver Hall Asylum: The doctor is in...sane, criminally! Step into the waiting room to be admitted, but watch your back as therapy in this gruesome clinic typically turns fatal. Additional fee required.

GHOUL RULES

- Our scare-aracters job is to scare you—not the reverse. Guests who taunt, touch or yell at our creepy characters or other guests will be ejected from the park without a refund.
- Do not touch or remove props, scenery, webbing or landscaping. Damage to park property is cause for ejection without a refund.
- Children 12 and under are permitted to wear costumes and face paint. No masks are permitted in the park. Guests will be required to remove such items for safety reasons.

MONSTER-TAINMENT

Geared to Teens & Adults

- Welcome to Arania's Nightmare: This classic comical show is back as Arania, the Black Widow Bride, is on a manhunt for husband number 14. It seems the other 13 have all met with mysterious ends.
- Fright Fest Radio Remote: The crew of 1313 WBAT Fright Time Radio cook up some of the most rockin' Halloween tunes and give away spooky prizes.
- Dr. Fright's Final Freak Out: All the neighborhood ghouls, zombies, and goblins bring Dr. Fright to life every evening before the park closes.
- Dead Man's Party Presents Zombie A-ROCK-ALYPSE: All of our Six Flags zombies and ghouls gather in a frightfully entertaining spooktacular musical and dance to the beat of their own demented drum.
- The Final Challenge: Watch as three not-so-lucky contestants compete in the most shocking games to win spooktacular prizes.

THEMED SCAREZONES - Free Attraction

- Texas Scare-a-tory: The once feared, murderous desperados of the lawless west were unceremoniously sent to their final resting place in Boot Hill. Legend has it they are now roaming the streets searching for their next showdown.
- Voodoo Swamp: The original zombie myth came to life in the swamps and bayous of New Orleans decades ago. Now the spirits are calling the Caddo Lake Barge area their new home. Cursed are those that enter the Voodoo Swamp!
- Freaktown Side Show: Once a thriving traveling circus, Freaktown Side Show quickly lost its reputation when jealousy within its community lead to "elimination". Today, outsiders are not welcomed inside, or even near, what'd left of the tent.
- Bio-Mech Sector: This dilapidated power plant is still just as functional today as the day it opened, except its purpose is darker and more evil. Anyone who goes near disappears... for good.
- Camino de los Vampiros: Hidden away near the Mexico border lies a village that legends say was taken over by Vampiric outlaws. These monsters are now starting to hunt a little further from home.
- Boomtown Terror: In 1786, people from all parts of the continent fled to Boomtown, Texas once they caught wind of the Boomtown mines, but the locals were less than welcoming.
